National Air Attack Academy 2016

The National Aviation Offices of the Bureau of Land Management and the US Forest Service are sponsoring the National Air Attack Academy February 15 - 26, 2016. The intent of the academy is to increase the speed to competency of ATGS candidates through enhanced delivery of the S-378 Aerial Supervision curriculum.

The two-week program includes:

- Sand table exercises
- Flight simulator exercises
- Labs
- Lecture
- Flight time



Target Audience:

Individuals who are qualified as Incident Commander Type 3/Division Supervisor will be considered. Candidates will be vetted based on the following criteria, as outlined on the Supplemental Nomination Form:

- An interview with an ATGS Instructor
- An incident ride-along
- Supervisory approval enabling candidates to be available for fire season training assignments

Recruitment:

The National ATGS Cadre, Geographic Area Training Representatives (GATRs), and fire operations communities will work together on focused recruitment of ATGS candidates. The program will include mentorship and monitoring of students to ensure training assignment priority and Position Task Book completion.



Nomination Process:

Candidates are required to submit a standard course nomination in IQCS (S-378 session #49) and a supplemental nomination form, which can be downloaded at nationalfiretraining.net. Nominations and Supplemental Nominations are due November 1, 2015. Supplemental Nominations should be submitted to course coordinator Shaylor Sorensen at stsorens@blm.gov. The National ATGS Cadre and GATRs will work together to make course selections.
